Milagro Community Garden







What is this place? It's a community garden of about 30 plots. The average plot size is 10×16 . We garden with organic methods, so no chemicals have been used.

Who can join? Anyone! It does require a commitment for the whole season. You're welcome to share a plot with a friend.

What is the cost? There is a one-time fee of \$30 to join and \$25 per year for the plot. However, we want everyone to be able to garden, so if finances are an issue, please talk with us.

Who owns the land? The Lutheran Church of the Servant has graciously shared the land with the community to grow food. As an extension of the church's mission, we donate a portion of what we grow (8lbs/person/year) to local food pantries. We are located behind the church, which is at 2481 Legacy Ct, just off Rodeo Road.

What do you grow? Flowers, vegetables, fruit and ornamentals. Each plot is unique. Some examples are chiles, tomatoes, squash, beans and sunflowers.

Why have a community garden? There are many benefits to gardening at Milagro Community Garden. Having a shared sense of community is one reason. We share resources, gardening knowledge and compost. We sometimes do classes on gardening and food preparation. We have community work days and projects. Most importantly, we all learn from each other - our experiments, successes and challenges.
